**FRONT & CENTER WITH JOHN CALLAWAY AND PRITZKER
MILITARY LIBRARY HOST PRESTIGIOUS PANEL DISCUSSION
AND BOOK SIGNING EVENT**

Panelists Include General Anthony Zinni, USMC (Ret.), Benjamin Page, and Charles L. Glaser Speaking on the Topic of- The Battle for Peace: A Frontline Vision of America's Power and Purpose

Chicago, IL, (April 21, 2006) – The Pritzker Military Library (www.pritzkermilitarylibrary.org) today announced a FRONT & CENTER with John Callaway panel discussion and book signing event on General Anthony Zinni's *The Battle for Peace: A Frontline Vision of America's Power and Purpose*. The event will take place at the Pritzker Military Library, 610 N. Fairbanks Ct., 2nd Fl. April 27, 2006, 5:00 pm reception, 6:00 pm live web cast and panel discussion.

The panel discussion comes at a time when a growing number of high ranking retired officers are speaking out for a sweeping change in administration strategy and leadership. In his new book, Zinni questions the effectiveness in recognizing international objectives, meeting global challenges, and just how well America is leveraging its power and influence in the war on terror. Moderator John Callaway will lead the discussion featuring General Zinni, Benjamin Page and Charles Glaser.

Panelists include:

General Anthony Zinni, USMC (Ret.) retired in July 2000 after nearly 40 years of service, serving as commander in chief of U.S. Central Command, MacDill Air Force Base, FL. General Zinni recently wrote *The Battle for Peace: A Frontline Vision of America's Power and Purpose*.

Benjamin Page is the Gordon S. Fulcher Professor of Decision Making at Northwestern University, in the Department of Political Science and the Institute for Policy Research. Professor Page received his Ph.D. from Stanford University and JD from Harvard Law School, where he studied international law. His interests include American politics and U.S. foreign policy, with particular interests in public opinion and policy making, the mass media, empirical democratic theory, and political economy.

Charles L. Glaser is professor and deputy dean of the Harris School of Public Policy at the University of Chicago. He focuses on international relations, especially issues of international security and defense policy. His current policy-oriented research examines U.S. nuclear strategy and forces. Glaser has published articles on structural realism, the security dilemma, and the offense-defense balance.

Moderator John Callaway After a broadcast journalism career of 48 years, John Callaway is now engaged in writing, freelance broadcasting and speaking. The long-time host of Chicago Tonight on Chicago public television station WTTW Channel 11, Mr. Callaway is now host and senior editor for "Chicago Stories", a documentary and interview weekly program on WTTW and host of "Friday Night". He has been honored with more than one hundred awards, including the coveted Peabody Award and fifteen Emmys.

"Front and Center with John Callaway is the perfect forum to discuss General Anthony Zinni's new work," commented Ed Tracy, Executive Director of Pritzker Military Library. "Showcasing two of Chicago's most influential policy and decision making enthusiasts will provide worthwhile commentary surrounding current issues facing America today."
